SPRIG Steering Committee met with Sabine Lehr of the Inter Cultural Association (ICA) on December 11th. We were encouraged and informed about many things, and also advised to *be patient*.

Before meeting with Sabine Lehr again on January 11th each Steering Committee member will complete several forms. After all that paperwork is processed to ensure capacity and good intentions, the Steering Committee will enter into a formal agreement with the Canadian government and ICA to become jointly liable with ICA to provide defined financial and settlement support for one year to a refugee family.

FAQ's (Frequently Asked Questions):

<i>How long before SPRIG's family arrives?</i>	Processing private sponsorship applications takes time. Perhaps six months? A year? Or more?
<i>Who will have "hands on" contact with the refugee family?</i>	Volunteers must be registered with ICA and complete a Criminal Records Check before working closely with a refugee family. At this time the Steering Group will register.

Be patient, there is time to learn and do this well.

How to Make a 2015 Charitable Donation to SPRIG

Until SPRIG has a case-specific account at the ICA there is only one way to make a charitable donation to this initiative and receive a tax receipt. That way is via **St. John's United Church - Refugee Sponsorship Fund**. All the funds received by St. John's will be transferred to the ICA account when it is established.

To donate to SPRIG:

1. Make your cheque payable to **St. John's United Church - Refugee Sponsorship Fund**. Note: St. John's cannot accept debit or credit card payments.
2. Ensure that your name and current mailing address, as well as an email address if you have one, are clearly indicated on the cheque so that the tax receipt can be sent to you.
